
The MA DSRIP TA Program

The MA DSRIP TA Program was created by MassHealth, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program, to support and build the capacity of Accountable Care Organizations, Community Partners, and Community Service Agencies. The TA Program launched in September 2018 as part of a statewide effort to improve the health outcomes and experiences of MassHealth members. The information in this infographic reflects data through September 30, 2019.

TA Applications - How are ACOs and CPs thinking about TA resources to build strong, effective organizations?

The darker bar represents the proportion of ACO TA applications that seek to advance a particular Competency Area; the **lighter bar** represents the proportion of CP TA applications that seek to advance a particular Competency Area.



Competency Areas outline the key spaces within which ACOs and CPs should continually develop their capabilities in order to improve experience and health outcomes while lowering total cost of care for MassHealth members. A single TA project may build ACO or CP capabilities within multiple Competency Areas.


ACO and CP TA Projects



There are 9 TA Domains that reflect the areas of TA that MassHealth ACOs and CPs identified as TA priority areas during their first year of implementation.

Total TA Card Funds Spent on TA Projects

ACO and CP TA projects range in size and scope, with the largest TA project budget at \$375,000 and the smallest at \$9,914. Total TA Cards funds spent on TA Projects through September 30, 2019 is \$7.9M; \$5.2M by ACOs and \$2.7M by CPs.




CP works with their preferred TA Vendor to develop a SOW and budget. Rapid review and approval takes place to ensure efficient project start-up.


Currently, 26 unique TA Vendors (55.3% of the TA Vendor catalog) are working on the 81 active TA projects with ACOs
