
## The MA DSRIP TA Program

The MA DSRIP TA Program was created by MassHealth, the Commonwealth of Massachusetts' Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program, to support and build the capacity of Accountable Care Organizations, Community Partners, and Community Service Agencies. The TA Program launched in September 2018 as part of a statewide effort to improve the health outcomes and experiences of MassHealth members. The information in this infographic reflects data through December 31, 2019.

### TA Applications - How are ACOs and CPs thinking about TA resources to build strong, effective organizations?

The darker bar represents the proportion of ACO TA applications that seek to advance a particular Competency Area; the **lighter bar** represents the proportion of CP TA applications that seek to advance a particular Competency Area.


- Respect, understand, and engage MassHealth members



Competency Areas outline the key spaces within which ACOs and CPs should continually develop their capabilities in order to improve experience and health outcomes while lowering total cost of care for MassHealth members. A single TA project may build ACO or CP capabilities within multiple Competency Areas.

## **ACO and CP TA Projects**








There are 9 TA Domains that reflect the areas of TA that MassHealth ACOs and CPs identified as TA priority areas during their first year of implementation. The difference in CP applications and CP projects in the Population Health Management TA Domain can be attributed to a single TA Vendor engaged in a joint TA project involving multiple CPs. Additional coordination time has been needed to finalize this large joint project.

Total TA Card Funds Spent on TA Projects ACO and CP TA projects range in size and scope, with the largest TA project budget at \$375,000 and the smallest at \$9,914. Total TA Cards funds spent on TA Projects through December 31, 2019 is \$9.2M; \$6.1M by ACOs and \$3.1M by CPs.




#### TA Application Approval ACOs and CPs submit a brief TA project application through the TA Marketplace to expedite approval. The

number of TA applications includes 5 from ACOs for 2 joint TA projects and 54 from CPs for 11 joint TA projects. Joint TA projects have multiple ACOs and CPs that come together for a single TA project. Median days to approval is eight. 40

#### **Budget Approval** Once a TA project application is approved, the ACO or

CP works with their preferred TA Vendor to develop a SOW and budget. Rapid review and approval takes place to ensure efficient project start-up.


Median days to approval is seven.
